Auckland Museum is the must-see destination for your visit to Auckland, Tāmaki Makaurau. Get up-close and connect with Aotearoa New Zealand's land, culture and people. Discover some of the world's finest taonga (treasures) and immerse yourself in stories that you won't hear anywhere else.

Set over three floors, the Museum is housed in one of the country's most stunning neoclassical heritage buildings, located in Auckland Domain, the city's most beautiful park.



Guided tours: Highlights of the Museum

Take a tour with one of our local guides as they share their knowledge with you. Hear about Aotearoa's people and their place in the Pacific, the remarkable flora and fauna found from north to south, and the conflicts that have shaped our nation. You will also find out about one of New Zealand's finest heritage buildings, the Museum itself.



Connect with Pacific culture

Enjoy a rich encounter with the cultures of diverse Pacific Island groups – New Zealand's closest neighbours. Our two Pacific galleries present the art of the Pacific people and showcase just under 2,000 of the most beautiful and important Oceanic treasures in the world. Objects range from full-sized canoes and feathered cloaks to shields, masks and jewellery.



Three floors of our stories

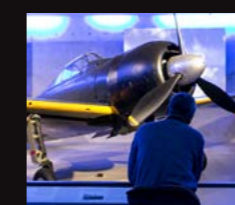
Discover our land of fire, flora and fauna

Enter the ever-popular interactive Volcanoes Gallery and encounter the fiery forces that shaped New Zealand, then experience a simulated eruption inside the Volcano House. In Origins Gallery, become immersed in our award-winning natural history displays where you will come face to face with some of our ancient creatures: the moa, kiwi, tuatara and dinosaurs.



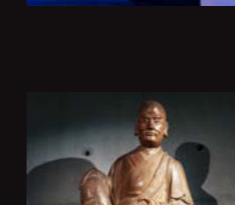
Stories of our people at war

Enter our war memorial galleries and share in the stories of heroism, sacrifice and hope during the conflicts that have shaped our nation. Home to Zero and Spitfire planes, these galleries feature dynamic displays centred around World War I and World War II, the New Zealand wars, and later conflicts.



Our art and design

Across six galleries, get up-close with extraordinary objects of beauty and creativity, ancient to modern. Our collections represent art and design from the diverse cultures of Asia, a major survey of New Zealand design and decorative arts, rare musical instruments, as well as international works from Coco Chanel, Art Nouveau and Bauhaus, to name a few.

How to get here

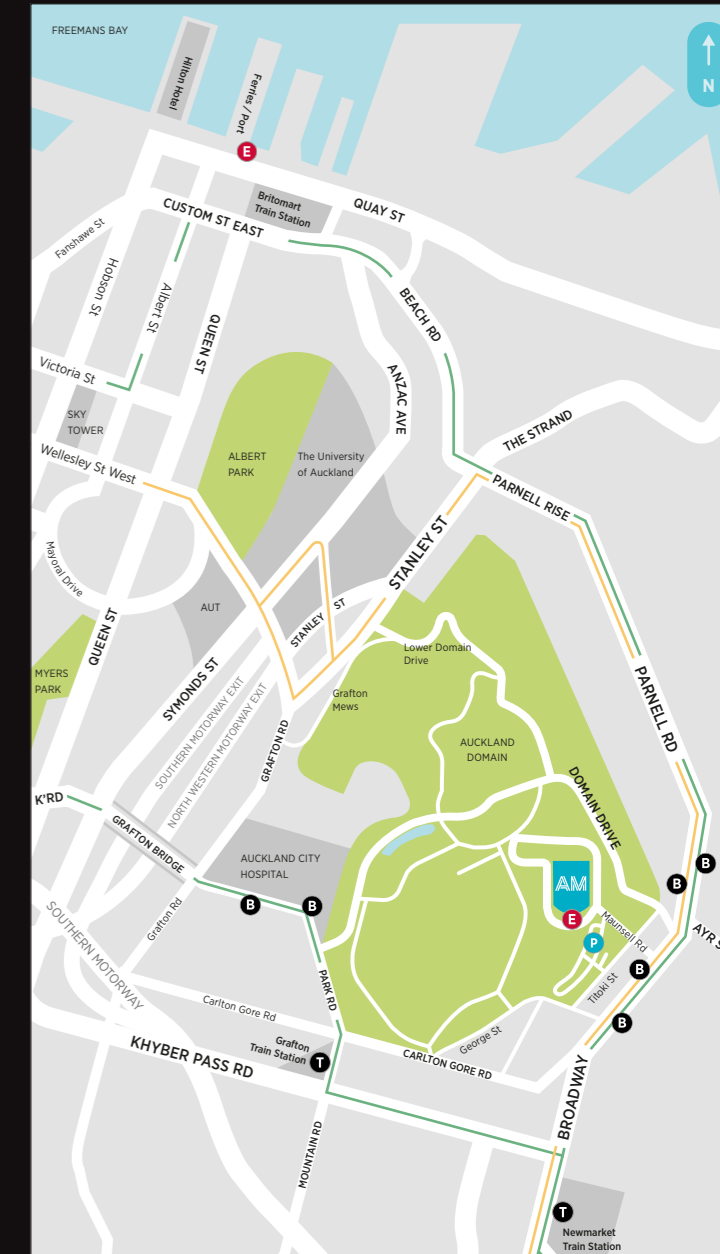
AM Auckland Museum is on Domain Drive in Auckland Domain and is a 25-minute walk or 10-minute drive from the city centre.

B The LINK Bus stops on Parnell Road every 10 to 15 minutes.

E The EXPLORER Bus is a 'hop-on, hop-off' sightseeing tour. Buses leave every 30 minutes (hourly in winter). Charges apply – 0800 4 EXPLORER. Your EXPLORER Bus ticket gives you a 10-20% discount off your Museum experience.

P Parking is available in the Auckland Domain or in the Museum's paid secure underground carpark, the first 30 minutes are FREE. We recommend leaving your valuables in the Museum lockers.

T Grafton train station (western line) is a 10-minute walk and Newmarket station (western/southern lines) is a 15-minute walk to the Museum.

Māori treasures

Marvel at Auckland Museum's stunning range of over 1,000 Māori taonga (treasures) on display – one of the most significant collections of Māori artefacts in the world. Dating back to the arrival and settlement of Māori to Aotearoa New Zealand, highlights include rare carvings, beautiful woven and feather cloaks, original full-sized buildings, and also the last great war canoe used in battle – carved from a single giant tōtara tree.

Māori cultural performances

Join our talented performers on a vibrant journey through the story of Aotearoa New Zealand and Tāmaki Makaurau Auckland. Recognised as one of the best Māori cultural experiences in New Zealand, the show culminates in an unforgettable version of the world-famous haka.

After the show, be sure to take the opportunity to meet, talk and take photos with our friendly performers. Auckland Museum is the only venue in Auckland offering daily performances.
