# Engage with territories across Africa as outbound mobility continues to grow

ICEF Africa, which was held in Rwanda's capital of Kigali in 2025, connects education providers from around the world with quality, ICEF-screened international student recruitment agents from 25+ countries across the continent, including Cameroon, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Nigeria, Rwanda, Senegal, Tanzania, Uganda, and Zimbabwe. This year, 309 individuals, representing 239 organisations, attended the event from a total of 43 countries.

Over the course of three-days, **2,748 meetings** were held at the world-class Kigali Convention Centre, Rwanda.

#### **Education Providers**

A total of 132 educators, collectively representing 90 institutions, joined the event in Kigali this year. They came from 23 countries, with the top 5 being Canada (29%), the US (18%), the UK (11%), Germany (6%), and India (5%).

For 33% of the attending educators, this was their first ICEF event.

# **Student Recruitment Agents**

ICEF Africa was enthusiastically supported by our community of carefully pre-screened agents, with a total of **142 representatives attending from 134 organisations**.

This year saw agent representatives from 22 countries, with the top 5 being Nigeria (37%), Ghana (9%), Kenya (9%), Rwanda (7%), and Uganda (7%). 57% of attending agents held a senior management position, reflecting the importance of the event.

For 47% of the attending agents, ICEF Africa was their first ICEF event.

## Seminars & informal networking

ICEF Africa 2025 featured a comprehensive seminar programme, with 5 sessions designed to provide insight into key recruitment trends for the region. Subjects this year included a brief overview into building strategic partnerships; a discussion on how to meet the challenges of maintaining quality in student recruitment; a panel discussion focused on three key African countries – Nigeria, Ghana, and Kenya; a further panel on connecting African agents with organisations from the UK, US, and Canada; and a presentation on how to turn study permit refusals into new opportunities. Additionally, ICEF Africa featured a selection of roundtable debates, which allowed participants the chance to share their knowledge and experience with their peers.


